

ALPHABET HUNT

What you will need:

- Letters written on half-pages of paper



What to do:

1. Write large letters on half-pages of paper and place them around a room in your house.
2. Sitting behind your child, trace one of the letters on their back
3. Have your child go and collect the letter they think you drew on their back.
4. After 3 tries, show them the letter if they are still not sure. Trace the letter on their back as they trace it on the letter card.
5. Continue until your child has found all the letters.

What learning is happening:

Letter recognition is one of the base skills that children learn in Early Childhood. It is a great idea to make this learning tactile, engaging and spatially-aware, so this is a wonderful way to achieve this in a fun activity.
