

MEASURING OBJECTS

What you will need

- Objects around the house
- A ruler or measuring tape
- Paper and a pencil



What to do

1. Find objects from around the house that can be measured.
2. Measure the items using a ruler or measuring tape, and have your child draw the item, then together write the length in cms.
3. Afterwards, find another way to measure the item. You could measure it using your child's shoe, a coffee cup or anything else you can think of.

What learning is happening:
