

TEMPORARY ART

What you will need:

- Leaves, bark, other interesting things from outside.
- Paper or cardboard
- A painting or poster



What to do:

1. Collect interesting things from outside. Place them in a basket or container.
2. Inside, arrange the items on a piece of paper or cardboard to make a picture.
3. Compare the temporary art to a painting or poster. Talk about what would happen if you left the temporary art for week. How could you make it more permanent?
4. Take a photo to instantly turn the temporary art into a permanent memory!

What learning is happening:

Comparing and contrasting is a base skill for Mathematics, and it helps to build and cement language skills. An early appreciation of art is the foundation for a later love, and this is also a lovely chance to bond with your child around Visual Arts.
